To begin the application process for the University of Toronto, the applicants should first contact and obtain the agreement of a faculty advisor (or co-advisors) who is a member of EEB's graduate faculty. For candidates applying to faculty at St. George and the ROM, the nomination process will proceed as follows:

• Applicants will contact a faculty member(s) to determine whether they would be willing to support their application and, if the applicant receives a Banting postdoctoral fellowship, act as their advisor (or co-advisors) and support their research

- Applicants who have identified a proposed advisor(s), will submit the following materials by July 21, 2020.
- Cover letter indicating (i)the proposed faculty advisor(s); (ii)the date that they will be available to begin the position; and (iii)confirming that they are eligible for the fellowship (see below or information about eligibility)
- Very brief (0.5-1 page) summary describing the research that you would do in our department as a Banting Postdoc if your application is successful
- Curriculum vitae that includes the names and e-mail addresses of two (2) potential referees
- PDF copies of two publications

All application materials must be submitted as a single PDF in a single email to: Locke Rowe (<u>locke.rowe@utoronto</u>), and cc'd to Liz Rentzelos (<u>chair.sec@utoronto.ca</u>) by July 21, 2020

Applications not following the required format will be not be considered.

The top 2 pre-applications will be nominated to then complete key sections of the full Banting application by Aug. 1, 2020 for the Faculty of Arts and Science competition (information will be sent about requirements for the FAS competition to the top 2 applicants), and these will be considered for full evaluation with applicants from other fields.
