EEB268H1F – Plant and Microbial Diversity (0.5 FCE)

Course description: Introduction to the biology of algae, fungi, and land plants. Lectures and labs emphasize the diversity of organisms with a focus on life cycles, ecology, and evolution.

Estimated course enrolment: 60 students

Estimated TA support: 105 hours

Class schedule: Lectures – Mondays 6:00-8:00pm; and Labs – Mondays 1:00-4:00pm and 5:00-8:00pm

Sessional dates of appointment: September 1, 2026 to December 31, 2026

Minimum Qualifications: An academic background in ecology and/or evolutionary biology is required, specifically biology of algae, fungi and land plants.

Preferred Qualifications: A PhD in ecology and/or evolutionary biology is preferred. Prior experience teaching this or a similar university-level course is preferred.

Relevant Criterion: Past teaching experience is the more relevant criterion than the need to acquire experience in respect of these posted positions.

Description of the duties: Prepare and deliver lectures and laboratories; prepare course syllabus; supervise teaching assistants assigned to course; available for office hours; preparation, supervision, and grading of tests, assignments and examinations in accordance with University regulations as described in the Faculty of Arts & Science Academic Handbook.

BIO251H1S – Form, Function and Development in Plants (0.5 FCE)

Course description: This course is an introduction to structure, function and ecology of vegetative and reproductive processes in plants with a focus on flowering plants and gymnosperms. Topics of study in lecture and laboratory tutorials include photosynthesis, transport processes, plant reproduction, patterns of plant growth and development, and the role of hormones in plant development.

Estimated course enrolment: 132 students

Estimated TA support: 280 hours

Class schedule: Lectures – Tuesdays 5:00-7:00pm; and Tutorials – Mondays 2:00-3:00pm, 3:00-4:00pm, 5:00-6:00pm and 6:00-7:00pm

Sessional dates of appointment: January 1, 2027 to April 30, 2027

Minimum Qualifications: An academic background in ecology and/or evolutionary biology is required, specifically of flowering plants and gymnosperms.

Preferred Qualifications: A PhD in ecology and/or evolutionary biology is preferred. Prior experience teaching this or a similar university-level course is preferred.
